### Do Not Pack List

Here is a list of items that can't be packed into boxes and can't go into our moving truck. These items will need to be transported in your vehicle (we're happy to load/unload these items in/out of your vehicle).

### 1. Opened Liquids



#### Examples:

- salad dressing,
- olive oil,
- shampoo,
- cleaning products,
- freezer food,
- and more.

These items can leak through the cardboard boxes and damage your household items.

### 2. Flammables



#### Examples:

- alcohol (beer, wine, liquor),
- lighters/matches,
- gasoline/diesel/motor oil,
- kerosene.
- paint thinner,
- turpentine,
- nail polish remover (acetone),
- propane tanks,
- and more.

These items could cause a fire in our moving truck and damage your household belongings.

### 3. Firearms



#### Examples:

- guns,
- ammunition,
- and more.

We are unable to transport these items.

## 4. Dangerous or Hazardous Goods



#### Examples:

- fireworks,
- batteries,
- aerosols.
- fertilizers,
- pesticides,
- cleaning products,
- ammonia,
- paint/varnishes,
- fire extinguishers,
- pool chemicals,
  and anything with the hazardous/dangerous symbol outlined on the picture to the left.

We are unable to transport these items due to their dangerous/hazardous class.

## 5. Filthy items



#### Examples:

- lawn mower covered in glass clippings/oil,
- items from garage/shed that are overly filthy,
- and more.

These items could damage your household items in our moving truck and would either need to be cleaned or transport these items seperately.

# Additional Items that Can't be **Placed Into Storage**

## Non-perishable open food and plants



#### Examples:

- granola,
- rice,
- baking products,
- cereal,
- and more.

These items can attract rodents and insects which could damage your household items.
